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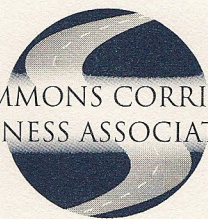

On August 18, 2010, the SCBA Board of Directors voted unanimously to support the following resolution:

**AFFIRMING SUPPORT FOR A
FEASIBILITY STUDY AND CONSTRUCTION DOCUMENTS FOR A
CONCEPTUAL TRAIL THROUGH THE STEMMONS CORRIDOR**

WHEREAS, A trail concept has been developed that will begin at Stemmons Park and continue north, passing through an office and commercial corridor containing the Dallas InfoMart and Market Center;


WHEREAS, Immediately adjacent to these two centers is the DART Market Center Station opening in December 2010 from which the trail will continue from this station underneath the DART elevated guideway, through the Southwestern Medical District/Parkland Station to the Inwood/Love Field Station and end at Weischel Park near Inwood and Denton Drive;

WHEREAS, a dedicated trail connection in combination with additional public and private investments for streetscape improvements and sidewalk enhancements will allow those living and visiting this area to access the Katy Trail, Trinity Strand Trail Phase I, three DART rail stations, three public schools, two public parks, the Southwestern Medical District, and residential and commercial areas with minimal or no use of private automobiles;

WHEREAS, building a trail through the SWMD and Stemmons Corridor could improve livability of the corridor by connecting adjacent neighborhoods and schools to form a tighter knit community with areas for neighborhood interaction, resulting in enhanced quality of life by attracting new residents to the area, reducing dependence on automobiles, and creating useable urban green space;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE Stemmons Corridor Business Association unequivocally supports a feasibility study and construction documents for a conceptual trail through the Stemmons Corridor.
