

Case Study: Mama's Daughter's Diner and Crime Prevention Efforts

Introduction

Mama's Daughter's Diner, a beloved establishment in the Stemmons corridor, has recently faced a surge in criminal activity. The diner has experienced issues impacting the safety of its patrons and employees. Challenges Faced

In recent months, there has been a concerning increase in crime and suspicious activity around Mama's Daughter's Diner, specifically within their parking lot, which is shared with other local businesses between 3 p.m. and 3 a.m. Owner and long-time SCBA member Nancy Procaccini was kind enough to share this information with us and wants to be sure her neighbors are alerted also. 


SCBA's Response

Recognizing the urgent need for enhanced security, the SCBA Executive Director utilized our relationship with our NPOs to support Mama's Daughter's Diner. This allowed for:

- An immediate on-site assessment of the diner's security needs, resulting in recommendations to bolster safety measures.
- The installation of a camera tower to monitor the parking lot, serving as a strong deterrent against crime and allowing DPD to monitor the situation. This camera tower was installed hours after we met with Nancy.
- Coordinate a security survey led by our NPOs to evaluate the site's vulnerabilities and provide tailored recommendations.
- Our NPO communicated his assessment with his department, resulting in extra patrols being implemented in the area.

In addition, efforts like decoy and bait cars were discussed as additional strategies to deter criminal activity should they be needed.







Importance of Reporting

Reporting incidents and suspicious activity is crucial for maintaining community safety and security. Urging employees and patrons to report crimes or suspicious activities helps address immediate threats and contributes to a broader understanding of crime patterns in the area. Having camera footage and images can significantly bolster these reports.

The cumulative impact of numerous reports strengthens the case for allocating additional patrols and resources, such as bait cars, decoy vehicles, and camera towers. These proactive measures enhance deterrence and ensure a stronger response to crime in our neighborhoods, ultimately fostering a safer environment for everyone.

A case number also enhances communication between the police and the reporting party, ensuring that follow-ups and updates are documented and accessible, promoting investigative accountability.

Furthermore, a case number lends credibility to reports from patrons and employees, highlighting the seriousness of incidents and justifying the need for increased resources and patrols in the area.
